The second half saw the High School taking advantage of the strong wind with some deep kicks testing the Academy full back, Alan Gaskin.

The only reward for their pressure was two converted penalties out of a possible four, letting Academy off the hook. Academy's flying winger Trevor Geary had the best chance of the second half but with neither team being very inventive the scoreline finished in Academy's favour.
